6" Square Envelosatchel

This project was inspired by the card caddy satchel by Lynn Smith - posted in the April/May 2008 projects

The completed envelosatchel measures 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " with $\frac{1}{2}$ " depth - lots of room for embellished card.

<u>Step 1:</u> Cut heavy double- sided card stock to a 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Score with RIGHT side of paper up.

<u>Step 2:</u> Align Scor-Mat underneath your Scor-Pal. This is so you can align the bottom point of paper correctly rather than eyeballing it.

Step 3: Align top point with second inverted triangle groove on Scor-Pal and bottom point just a little before the 7 3/8" line on Scor-Mat. Score at the 3 ½ " & 4 " - repeat on remaining 3 corners.

Step 4: Cut out notches where scored lines intersect.

<u>Step 5:</u> Fold on both lines on each corner and crease with Scor-Tool. Apply adhesive to inside edges of bottom flap where they will intersect with side flaps. Top flap can be fastened with adhesive or by applying velcro dot or magnet to inside of top flap and corresponding place on bottom of envelosatchel.

Step 6: Decorate/embellish as desired.
